HS Level 4 Standards and Benchmarks

Level 4 will review and consolidate the gains of levels 1, 2 and 3 as further preparation for advanced study. The main focus of the course is on language acquisition and development of language skills. These language skills are developed through the study and use of a range of written and spoken material. Such material will extend from everyday oral exchanges to literary texts, and is related to the culture(s) concerned.

1. Listening

Standard 1.1: Comprehend and interpret spoken language on diverse topics

Standard 2.2: Identify and interpret the varied linguistic components to ensure comprehension.

2.2.4a Identify and understand basic linguistic structures encountered in a text

3. Speaking

Standard 3.1: Present information, concepts and ideas to an audience of listeners on a variety of topics

- 3.1.4a Give a prepared presentation on a familiar topic with prompts
- 3.1.4b Create brief reports on topics of personal interest
- 3.1.4c Develop an argument well enough to be understood
- 3.1.4d Give basic reasons and explanations (for opinions, plans and actions)
- 3.1.4e Express thoughts on more abstract, cultural topics such as films, books, music, etc.
